NAZARETH:

This film is shot in the village of Nazareth Israel inside a rebuilt 1st Century synagogue. Learn the significance of why Jesus was chosen to do the reading of Isaiah 61 on that day, and why the people were infuriated at what He said to them. See the "Cliffs of the Precipice" on the outskirts of the city where they went to throw Him off.

CAPERNAUM:

Leaving Nazareth, Jesus took a 4 hour walk down to the Sea of Galilee to a small fishing village called K'far Nahum (Capernaum). See the small shoreline where He said "Follow Me and I will make you fishers of men" and made His first five disciples. See the synagogue where He was the Rabbi and visit Peter's home, where He likely lived.

JERUSALEM

We will visit the place where Jesus was crucified, buried and resurrected at "Church of the Holy Sepulchre". We will gaze at Jerusalem, like our Messiah did, from the Mount of Olives. We will visit the steps of the Second Temple where Jesus certainly would have walked through the gates.
